The Federal Trade Commission recently announced enhancements to IdentityTheft.gov – the federal government’s free, one-stop resource to help people fix problems caused by identity theft. <https://identitytheft.gov> now makes it easier for victims of identity theft to report it and recover from it. New features on the site allow people to:

- Get a personal recovery plan that walks them through each step
- Update their personal plan and track their progress
- Print pre-filled letters & forms to send to credit bureaus, businesses, and debt collectors
