As we voyage along through life;
Tis the set of a soul

While pondering the lines from the poem, "Tis the set of sails and not the gales which tells us the way to go," President elect Charlotte established the theme for her term of office: "SETTING THE SAIL." The current status of Credit Professionals International is analogous to a sailing ship driving toward its destination in the face of changing gales.
